The time is quickly approaching for your child to attend our MSU Summer Residential Camps. Many of you are starting to ask what you should be considering having your child bring to campus. Below is a list of suggestions for you.

Participants will be living in Shaw Hall. Our residential buildings ARE NOT air conditioned. It would be in the best interest of your child to bring a small fan. Bedding and towels are furnished. You do not need to bring these items. In case you feel you need to pack bedding items, the beds are extra-long twin beds. We assume no responsibility for the safe-keeping of any electronics your child brings (e.g., cell phone, i-pod, Wii, etc.). These items should be brought only with your child's understanding that they are solely responsible for them. Spending money for snacks will come in handy for your child. Participants should bring their own toiletry items (toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, hair brush, hair dryer, sunscreen, etc.)

Do not bring tank tops, any spandex, halter tops, muscle shirts, inappropriate logos (e.g., profanity, language, alcohol), short shorts, tight or revealing clothes, overly baggy pants or short skirts. We expect participants to dress appropriately as they are representing their schools, the program they are enrolled in, and Michigan State University. This dress code will be enforced.

Dress for classes, field trips to industrial sites and recreational activities are casual. Jeans or other washable casual pants, skirts or shorts, blouses, long-sleeved raincoat and sweatshirts; tennis shoes, and a bathing suit are appropriate.

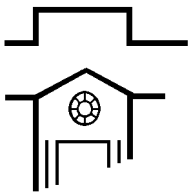
Dress for field trips to engineering firms, seminars and closing ceremonies is professional. Males are required to wear nice slacks, shirts and ties; females are required to wear skirts/dress slacks and blouses or dresses.
