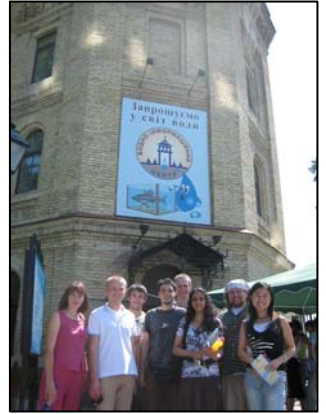


Ukraine: Engineering and Language

What's this program about?

This four-week summer program takes place in Kyiv (alternative spelling – Kiev), the capital of Ukraine. It will provide undergraduate engineering majors an opportunity to participate in environmental science and engineering research conducted as part of a National Science Foundation grant. At the same time, students will learn and experience Ukrainian life and culture.

Kyiv is situated on the Dnieper River and has a population close to three million people. Due to the large number of Orthodox churches in Kyiv, it is sometimes called the Golden-domed City. Classes will be held at the National University “Kyiv-Mohyla Academy” (UKMA), the oldest university in Eastern Europe. It was founded in 1615, but was closed by the Russian government in 1817 and then re-opened in 1991 after Ukraine gained independence.



Additional travel plans include field trips to the Crimean Peninsula in the south of Ukraine and the city of Lviv in the west.
