NEWS FROM THE ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

Our MSUCC Endowment is booming. Its market value is about \$300,000! With the investment account valued at \$14,000, the Scholarship Committee has decided to award four MSUCC scholarships, each for \$2,500 for the 2019-20 academic school year.

In addition to the MSUCC scholarships, we will also be awarding one scholarship each from the Karen Harsh Endowed Scholarship Fund and the Irene Arens Endowed Scholarship Fund. Each scholarship will be for \$2,500.

The colleges chosen for the 2019-20 academic year are "Women's and Gender Studies" in the College of Arts & Letters and/or from the College of Nursing.
